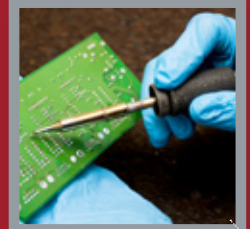
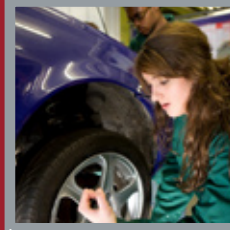
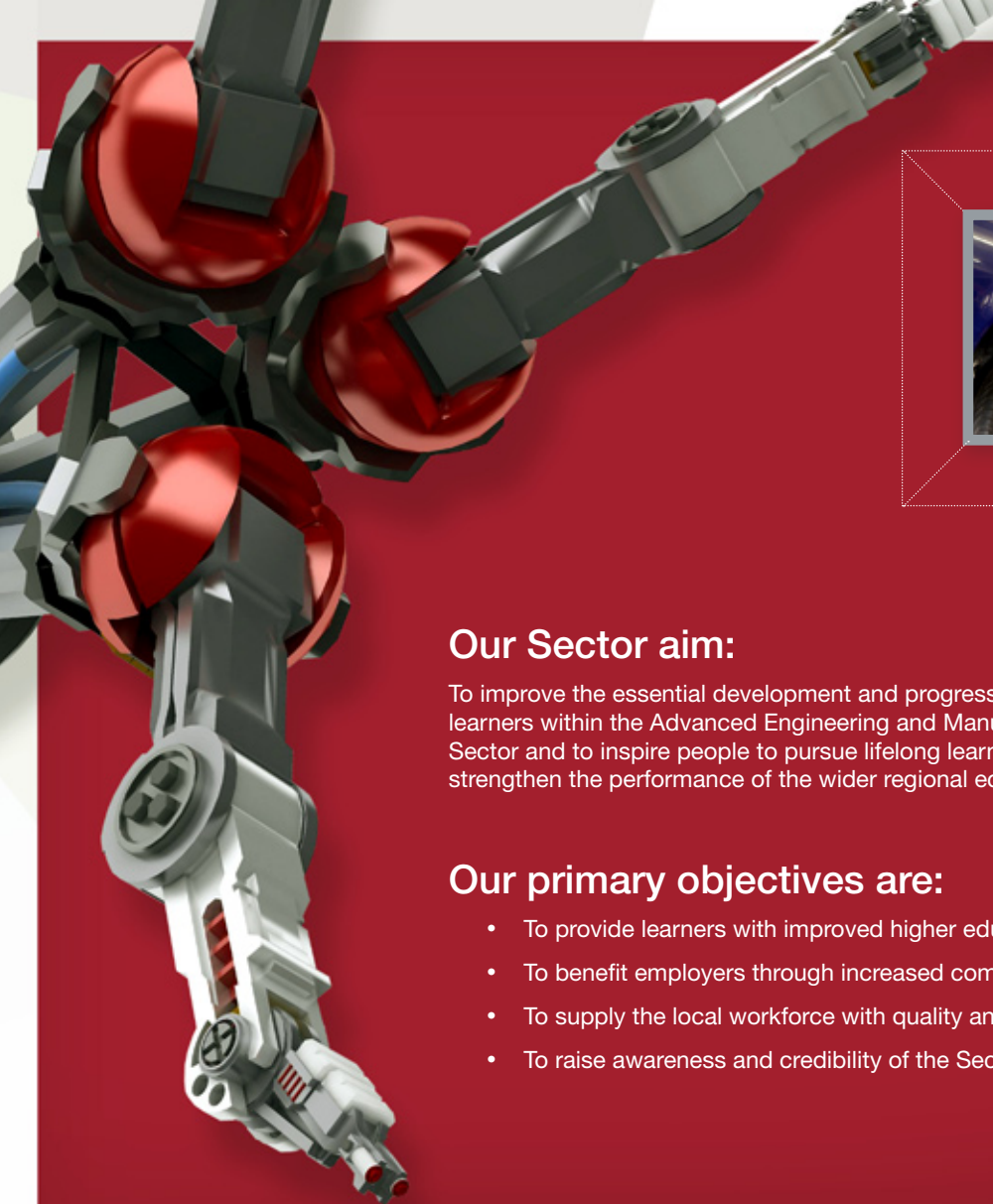
Why get involved?
